The NEED

PHOENIX

Increased homelessness, rising unemployment, families living in cars, and children entering into prostitution and sex trafficking—the **desperate needs in the Phoenix metropolitan area are staggering**. With **Phoenix** as the **fourth largest metropolitan area** in the United States, government at every level can and is helping but can't even begin to keep up with these ever growing needs. The Phoenix Dream Center (PDC) believes that if **individuals, businesses, and private foundations will join collectively together and work with existing organizations** that have the proven programs and dedicated volunteers—but lack funding to meet these needs—we can help not hundreds, but thousands of the hurting, hopeless, and homeless, giving them a helping hand at their greatest point of need.

Should we as a community sit back and do nothing?

Historical Results

This story begins in **2006**, with **Pastor Tommy Barnett's** realization that his church, Phoenix First Assembly, could not even begin to address the growing needs he saw, not just within his congregation, but on the streets of Phoenix. He stepped out in faith and purchased a **120,000 square foot facility** on Grand Avenue in **West Phoenix** that could be used to provide housing, food, education, and other assistance. **In the first three years, he raised 100% of the funds to pay off the facility** and partnered with a variety of organizations that today use the facility at no cost.



The results in three short years have been astonishing. The Phoenix Dream Center...

- 1** Houses **250** men and women that have been rescued out of **homelessness, drugs, gangs, prostitution**, and other destructive lifestyles. **Capacity to house of over 600** as funding and community support grows.
- 2** Provides **residents rehabilitation, life skills, anger management, domestic violence, and jobs training** to help them break out of the destructive cycle and into a **productive lifestyle**.
- 3** Feeds **over 9,000** people weekly by distributing **food boxes** in the community and operating a **free cafeteria**. Its **Thanksgiving Turkey Giveaway** and **Christmas Toy and Food Giveaway help over 20,000 people** each year. Thanks to a local company's recent donation, PDC opened a **new, fully operational commercial grade cafeteria kitchen** that provides an additional **3,000 hot meals each day** and over 1,000,000 hot meals each year.
- 4** Provides **free clothing** for over **4,000 people each week** through community programs and their on-site free store. PDC also distributes **computers, furniture, and household goods**, with the greatest needs being items for infants and toddlers.
- 5** Facilitates **youth programs with** other partner organizations that provides **meals** to homeless teenagers, **dance** classes, and **sports** programs and **leagues**, and personal **coaching** that challenges them to be successful in school and life.
- 6** Operates a **Wellness Center** that provides basic **health care, checkups, and OTC medications**. Case workers also assist with paperwork to **obtain health coverage and benefits** through state-funded programs.
- 7** Partners with the **City of Phoenix's "Work Force Connections,"** offering the unemployed assistance in building **resumes, job interview** training, enrolling in **vocational training** programs, and finding a job through **work search** programs.
- 8** Operates a **beauty salon and barber shop**, providing **free haircuts and hair treatments** to the homeless, unemployed, and lower income people, empowering them with the confidence needed to seek employment and advance in their positions.
- 9** Operates **The Rescue Project**, providing housing in **safe locations** throughout Phoenix for **underage girls** and adult **women** who have been rescued from **human trafficking and sex slavery**. Through partnerships, victims receive **all** the long-term residential, medical, and psychological **care necessary** to rebuild their lives and help restore their purity that has been stolen.
